This home will be cherished by a refugee family from Zambia. Pongo and Bawili and their six children lived in a refugee camp in Zambia for 12 years, after coming to the US they found friends in Iowa City and look forward to living in their new Habitat home.

# **Rush Pledge**

Recruitment was extremely exciting this fall! With over 50 applicants and one of the biggest pledge classes in quite some time (23 new members!), the fraternity has gained several wonderful new actives. However, the larger number of applicants reminded the fraternity how difficult the recruitment process can be. Because of this, the fraternity decided that—throughout the next few semesters—we will implement a more organized and specialized selection process and a more informative pledging process. We look forward to the upcoming semesters and the revitalized rush pledge process.

We held weekly meetings, including a Brotherhood Event organized by the pledge class, to provide the pledges with information regarding the fraternity's history, goals, and standards. This semester, we tried our best to follow the guidelines set by the new Standard Model of pledge education, which laid out the requirements of every meeting this semester. It was a useful model for pledge education, and helped us set the standards of the weekly meetings from the beginning.



Additionally, we held three rounds of PAABB (Pledge, Active, Alumni, Brotherhood Bonding) and the pledge class organized the Brotherhood Event to help the actives get to know the large class. It was such a great year, and the fraternity is hopes to see an equal increase in interest in the fraternity during the Spring semester.

## **Fundraising**

In Fall 2016, the Fundraising committee worked to raise money for Theta Tau events such as the professional development luncheon and national conference. Local restaurants helped the committee raise money by allowing a fraction of the profits for a designated time period to be allotted to the fraternity. Buffalo Wild Wings and Bartot helped the committee do this, allowing us to raise over \$300. The marketing committee helped advertise these fundraisers throughout campus. In addition, Theta Tau worked the Party After the Parade event by hosting booths with games for University of Iowa families during homecoming week, which raised an additional \$100.
